Title: By-law 85-2 -control of vehicular parking during winter

There is a problem with parked vehicles hindering snow removal operations during the winter control period between Nov.1 and April 30. The proficiency of the winter control is being jeopardized when vehicles are encountered.

Pursuant to section 124-A of the Highway Traffic Amendment Act 1979, "No person shall deposit snow or ice on a roadway without permission in writing to do so from the Ministry or the road authority responsible for the maintenance of the road." All public roads and streets are defined as Highways under the said Act.

Therefore, it is recommended that any vehicle found parked or abandoned by the P.W. Supt., By-law Officer or their agents in such a manner as to interfere with the winter control operations of the Town of Mattawa will be towed away and the accompanying by-law adopted.

BY-LAW NO. 85-2

BEING a by-law to control vehicular parking during the winter control period of Nov. 1 to April 30.

AND WHEREAS the Highway Traffic Act disallows the hinderance of any winter control vehicles, it is hereby enacted as a By-law of the Municipal Corporation Town of Mattawa.

That no person shall park a vehicle from 12:00 am to 8:00 am in such a manner as to obstruct or hinder winter control vehicles engaged in winter controls.

AND THAT any vehicle so parked or abandoned will be removed at the owner's expense.

AND THAT neither the municipality nor any of its contractors shall be liable for damages caused to unlawfully parked vehicles by winter control equipment.

AND THAT neither the municipality nor any of the contractors shall be liable for damages in the removal of said unlawfully parked vehicles.
