WHEREAS in 2009, June was declared National Indigenous History month by the passing of a unanimous motion of the House of Commons;

AND WHEREAS recognizing National Indigenous History Month is an opportunity for citizens to learn more about the history of the Indigenous peoples in Canada – the first peoples of Canada;

AND WHEREAS in cooperation with Indigenous Peoples' national organizations, the Government of Canada designated June 21 as National Indigenous Peoples Day;

AND WHEREAS June 21 was chosen because it corresponds to the summer solstice, the longest day of the year, and for generations many Indigenous Peoples' groups have celebrated their culture and heritage at this time of year;

AND WHEREAS National Indigenous Peoples Day is a wonderful opportunity to become better acquainted with the cultural diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Metis peoples and to discover the unique accomplishments of Indigenous Peoples;

AND WHEREAS National History Month and Indigenous Peoples Day is small step towards reconciling the impacts still present from colonization, residential schools, and systemic racism; such as the disproportionate amount of violence against indigenous girls and women, the disproportionate amount of indigenous people incarcerated, the disproportionate amount of indigenous children in foster care, underfunding for Indigenous public services, and lack of clean water and infrastructure on reserves.

Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

Tenders were requested to carry out lawn maintenance services for the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa for years 2020, 2021 and 2022. A three year contract was agreed to be let which will give the Town of Mattawa a known cost for this service and will assist the contractor with a known contract when investing in equipment and staff. The bidders were requested to submit a tender with a lump sum on all maintenance areas as listed in the contract.

Areas includes; Dufoe Park, Lions Park, Annie's Park, Mattawa Conservation Island, Timmins Park, Mattawa Information Centre, Explorers Point/Mattawa Waterfront/Mattawa Museum, Mattawa Municipal Office/Cenotaph, Mattawan Street, Bissett Street, Mattawa Waterworks and Lift Stations.

The Corporation received two bids. The proper municipal procedures and tender terms and conditions were followed.

The bids were as follows:

Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

Pursuant to the recent municipal tax arrears sales process, the properties located at 333 Main Street and 200 Wood Street did not receive any tenders. The municipality now has two options under the Municipal Act, which were discussed at the last regular meeting of Council May 25th, 2020.

The two options are:

- 1) Within two years after the date of the public sale, offer the land for public sale by public auction or public tender, as the treasurer decides, a second time in accordance with the prescribed rules. This would follow the same process as already undergone.
- 2) Request the solicitor to prepare a Notice of Vesting to be registered on title for the lands in question. The municipality would then inherit title to the lands.

Council opted to choose the second option and have the municipal solicitor prepare notices of vesting for both properties. This process, once completed, will permit the tax arrears to be written off and the properties registered to the municipality.

Recommendation:

That Council of the Town of Mattawa authorizes Mr. Thomas Davis of Valin Partners, on behalf of the municipality, to prepare Notices of Vesting to be registered on title for the properties described as PIN 49102-0037(LT) 333 Main Street and PIN 49103-0609(LT) 200 Wood Street.
