WHEREAS the Province of Ontario and particularly rural areas such as the Town of Mattawa, are experiencing a severe shortage of physicians, leaving many people without access to medical care;

AND WHEREAS when the Province of Ontario realized the shortage of Personal Support Workers, they took progressive action to support Ontario colleges to provide free tuition for students who agreed to enter into this field of study and work;

AND WHEREAS it is recognized that the education costs for a physician can be a deterrent for students contemplating entering the medical field.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Town of Mattawa respectfully requests that the Province of Ontario and Government of Canada recognizes that the shortage in health care workers is not unique to Personal Support Workers but is also relevant to physician including specialists and general practitioners;

AND FURTHER THAT in order to support Ontario municipalities and their residents, the Provincial and Federal Governments take steps to provide support and subsidy to students entering medical school with the intention of becoming practicing physicians in the Province of Ontario and particularly in underserviced rural and northern municipalities;

AND FURTHER THAT the Provincial and Federal Governments work with Canadian universities to increase the number of students accepted into medical school and residency programs;

AND FURTHER THAT the Town of Mattawa supports whatever protective measures the Provincial and Federal Governments place on the subsidy given to ensure that the students receiving the funding become practicing physicians in the Province of Ontario.

TITLE: BY-LAW TO AMEND TAXI BY-LAW NO. 19-29

22-34 Draft By-law Item Policy Recommendation

Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa is the responsible authority for licensing, regulating and governing the owners and drivers of taxi cabs. Within their duties, Council may establish the rates or fares for this service, provide for the collection of such rates or fares and limit the number of taxicabs or any class of them.

The taxi rates and fares have not been brought before Council for approval since 2008. Staff requested the owner of Belanger Taxi to provide an updated price listing with the current rates and fares. Staff is seeking Council approval to amend Taxi By-Law No. 19-29 which will amend the current rates and fares.

For these reasons the following is recommended.

Recommendation:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa adopt By-Law No. 22-34 which is a By-law to accept the new updated price list from Belanger Taxi for taxi rates and fares as set out in Schedule “A” attached to the By-law.

CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF MATTAWA

BY-LAW NUMBER 22-34

BEING a by-law to amend By-law 19-29 which provides for the licensing, regulating and governing of owners and drivers of taxicabs used for hire for the transportation of passengers and to regulate the operation of taxicabs in the Town of Mattawa.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 151 of the Act, the municipality may pass a by-law under section 156 for licensing, regulating and governing the owners and drivers of taxicabs, may establish the rates or fares for this service, provide for the collection of such rates or fares and limit the number of taxicabs or any class of them.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa enacts as follows:

1. **THAT** By-law No. 19-29 be amended as follows:
 - a) **THAT** "Price List" from Belanger Taxi attached as Schedule "A" to this By-law be approved.
2. **THAT** this By-law shall come into force and take effect on the day of passing.
3. **THAT** Schedule "A" of By-Law 08-15 be repealed.

READ a **FIRST** and **SECOND** time, this 26th day of September 2022.

TITLE: SUPPLY AND REPLACEMENT OF ASPHALT ON MAIN STREET

 Draft By-Law X Item Policy Recommendation

Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

The Public Works Department has had several waterline breaks on the Main Street corridor in 2022 which caused the asphalt to be damaged in the repairs. Since winter is fast approaching there are six locations on Main Street that require paving to be completed before the winter season.

The Public Works Supervisor sought out three quotes for the supply and placement of superpave asphalt. A third quote was unable to be secured due to the MTO paving specifications. The results to pave all six locations are as follows:

Pioneer Construction	\$231.35	268	\$62,001.80

Staff has reviewed the quotes and would recommend Pioneer Construction being the lower tender for the replacement of asphalt on Main Street. The work will be performed and completed before the end of 2022.

Council budgeted \$50,000.00 this year for asphalt replacement however there have been additional water breaks since budget approval. Federal Gas Tax Funds will be used to offset this expense and for these reasons the following is recommended:

Recommendation:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa authorize the supply and placement of superpave asphalt on the Main Street corridor in six locations to be completed by Pioneer Construction at a price of \$62,001.80 plus HST and that this expense will be funded with Federal Gas Tax Funds.
