Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

Council at their regular meeting of August 22, 2022 spoke of Correspondence # 4.4 from the Town of Hanover with regards to the shortage of physicians in Ontario.

Our community, like many others, face a shortage in physicians leaving many families without a family doctor and the ability to get basic medical care without having to visit the emergency department. This puts a strain on the hospitals as well as the families that are required to wait hours to be seen by a physician.

Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa is requesting the Provincial and Federal Governments take the steps to provide support to students entering the field of medicine with intentions of becoming practicing physicians in the Province of Ontario.

For these reasons the following is recommended:

Recommendation:

WHEREAS the Province of Ontario and particularly rural areas such as the Town of Mattawa, are experiencing a severe shortage of physicians, leaving many people without access to medical care;

AND WHEREAS when the Province of Ontario realized the shortage of Personal Support Workers, they took progressive action to support Ontario colleges to provide free tuition for students who agreed to enter into this field of study and work;

AND WHEREAS it is recognized that the education costs for a physician can be a deterrent for students contemplating entering the medical field.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Town of Mattawa respectfully requests that the Province of Ontario and Government of Canada recognizes that the shortage in health care workers is not unique to Personal Support Workers but is also relevant to physician including specialists and general practitioners; **AND FURTHER THAT** in order to support Ontario municipalities and their residents, the Provincial and Federal Governments take steps to provide support and subsidy to students entering medical school with the intention of becoming practicing physicians in the Province of Ontario and particularly in underserviced rural and northern municipalities;

AND FURTHER THAT the Provincial and Federal Governments work with Canadian universities to increase the number of students accepted into medical school and residency programs;

AND FURTHER THAT the Town of Mattawa supports whatever protective measures the Provincial and Federal Governments place on the subsidy given to ensure that the students receiving the funding become practicing physicians in the Province of Ontario.

Mayor D. Backer and Members of Council:

Winter is fast approaching and the Public Works Department is in need of winter sand and salt to maintain our municipal roads for the 2022-2023 season.

The Public Works Supervisor sought out four quotes and the results are as follows:

Company	Tonnes Required	Price Per Tonne	Total
Compass Minerals	54 tonnes of salt	\$124.99	\$6,749.46
A. Miron Topsoil	1500 tonnes of sand	\$10.20	\$15,300.00
Adshead Trucking Ltd	1500 tonnes of sand	\$15.90	\$23,850.00

All prices are plus HST.

Staff reached out to Bruman Construction to provide a quote for sand which they declined to quote at this time.

Staff has reviewed the quotes and would recommend purchasing the winter salt from Compass Mineral and the winter sand from A. Miron Topsoil.

For these reasons the following is recommended:

BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Corporation of the Town of Mattawa authorize the purchase of the winter salt to Compass Mineral in the amount of \$6,749.46 plus HST and the winter sand to A. Miron Topsoil in the amount of \$15,300.00 plus HST.
